I would like to introduce myself. My name is Lisa Kroll. I am a long time resident here in Monroe County. Both of my children attended University Elementary School (UES), Tri-North Middle School and completed their secondary education at Bloomington High School North. My oldest graduated in May from Indiana University with a degree in Journalism. My youngest, a junior, is heading to Disney World this fall to do a college internship dancing in the parades. She is a former pre-college IU ballet student as well.

When my children were in elementary school I was highly involved with the UES PTO (Janice Bizarri and Michi McClaine era). I also started working for the PTO as one of the school's first literacy facilitators in the fall of 2000.
